

# Looma splits week defeats Beaumont

**Looma 7-Beaumont 0

Looma slipped from second to third in the South Edmonton Recreational Fastball League (SERFL) after they split two games last week.

Looma lost a close battle at home Thursday to Fultonvale 3-1 but won their previous match Tuesday 7-0 over Beaumont Royals in Beaumont.

Peck and Kerry Peck singled, Dave Seib smashed a line drive towards left-centre field but Herb Bishhoff made a superb catch to make the third and final out of the game.

Ron Liepert was voted Fultonvale's most valuable player of the game going three for four at the plate and scoring once.
