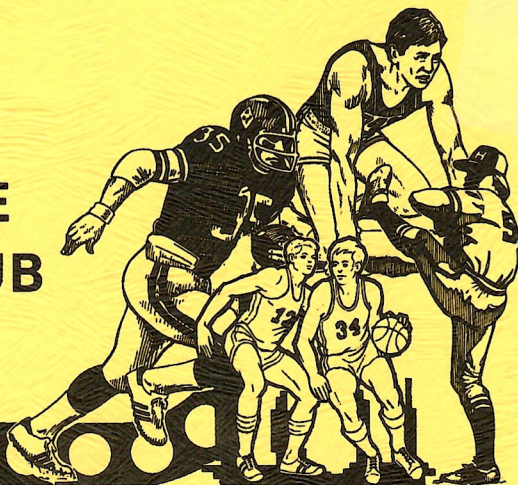


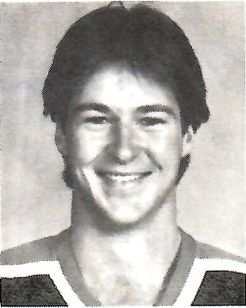

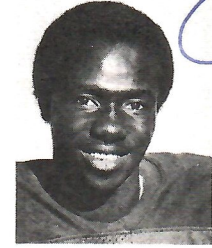

Kevin Lowe

Kevin Lowe is the first junior player ever selected by the Oilers following their entry into the NHL in 1979. Lowe had spent 3 years with the Quebec Remparts during which time he had become known as an offensive minded rearguard.

Kevin has adjusted well to the more disciplined style of play in the pros, providing the Oilers with one of the premier defensive blueliners in the league. During the first 3 years in the league, Lowe recorded 21 goals, and has 74 assists. 1982-83 will likely prove to be his most offensive season yet. Lowe was selected to play for team Canada in last spring's World Championships in Finland.

The 23 year old Lowe is single and lives in Edmonton in the off season.



Waddell Smith #71

Waddell Smith

Waddell is a 7 year veteran of the Eskimos, joining the team in 1977 after being released by the Kansas City chiefs of the NFL.

His best season was in 1979 when he recorded 74 catches for 1,214 yards and 13 touchdowns. He was a CFL All-Star and runner-up for the Schenley Award as outstanding player. After missing several games early this past season, Smith rebounded in the second half to record 35 catches for 639 yards. He scored 7 touchdowns and had a spectacular 18.2 yard average per catch.

Smith is noted for his speed and can clock the 40 in 4.2 seconds. A college track star at Kansas, Smith narrowly missed a U.S. Olympic Team berth in 1976. Smith is married and spends the off season in both Edmonton and Los Angeles.

Al Oliver

1982 was Al Oliver's first year with the Montreal Expos, but turned out to be the most productive in the first basemen's 15 year career.

Oliver led the entire national league in batting in 1982 with a .331 average. In addition he led the Expos in hits with 204 and R.B.I.'s with 109.

Oliver joined Montreal in an off season trade with Texas. He has hit over .300 in each of the last seven seasons. He now ranks among the top ten active run producers in baseball.

Oliver has participated in 5 All Star Games and has a lifetime batting average in excess of .300. The 36 year old Oliver spent the first nine years of his career with the Pittsburgh Pirates. Earlier this year he was rewarded for his outstanding season by being named Expos player of the year.
